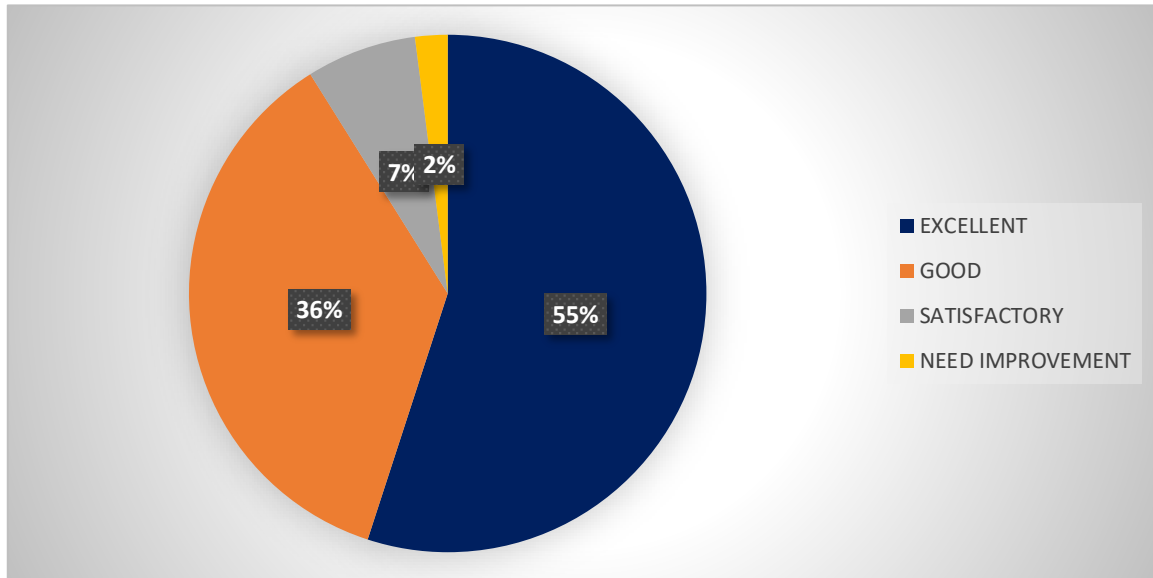
ALUMNI FEEDBACK

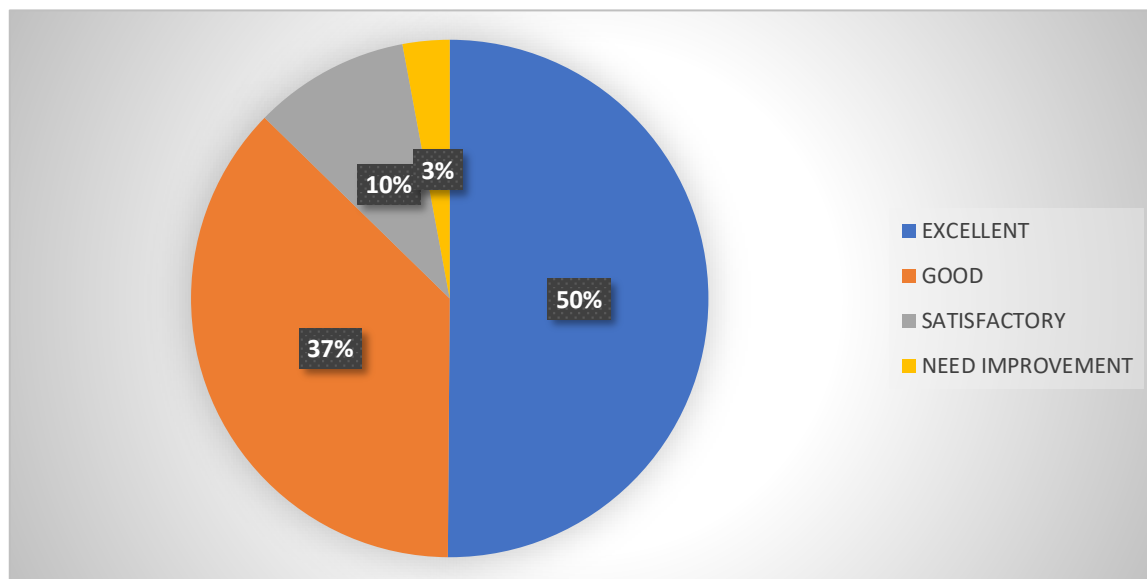


Inference:

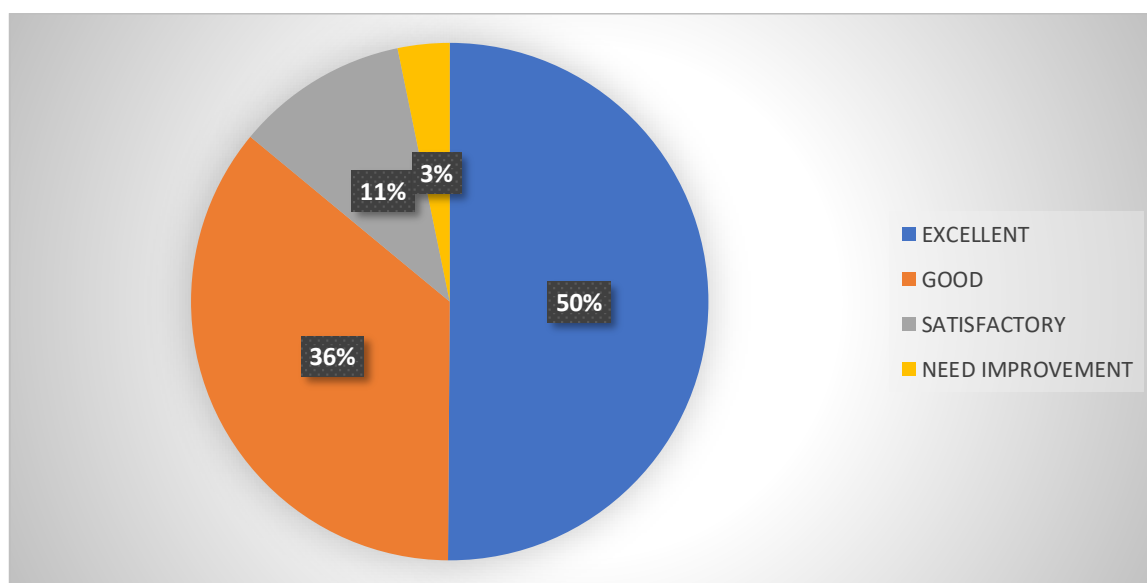


Inference:

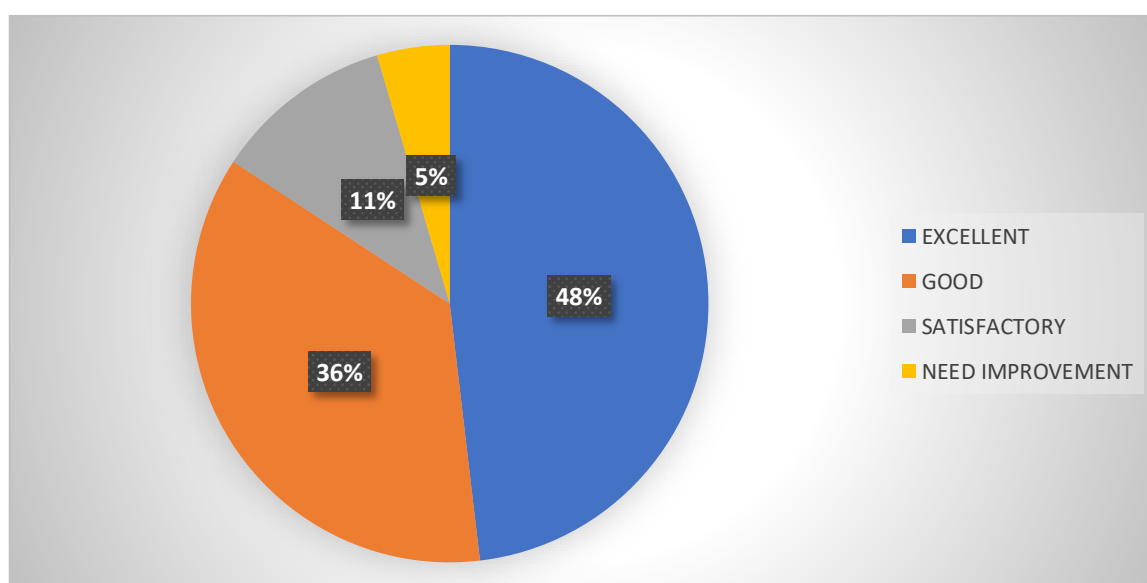


Inference:

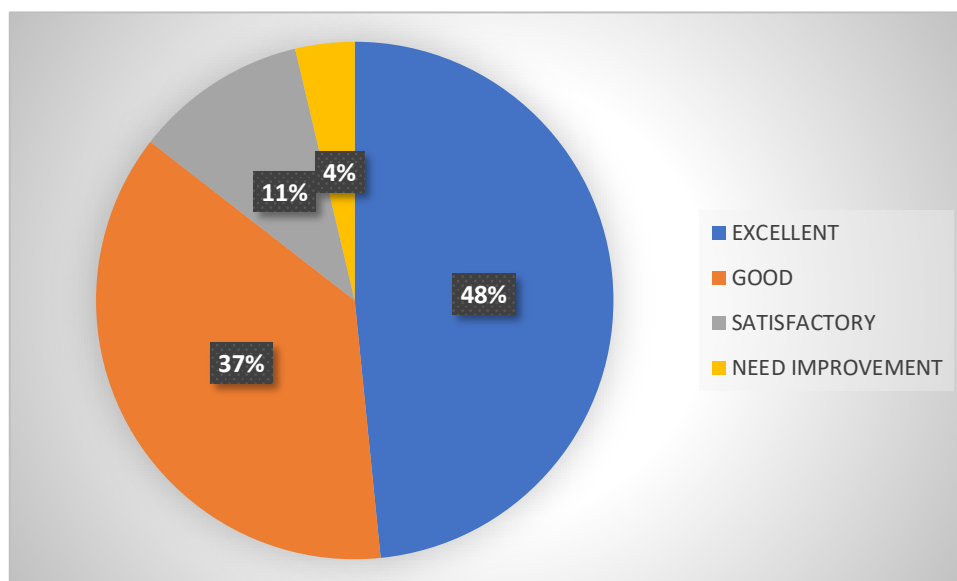


Inference:

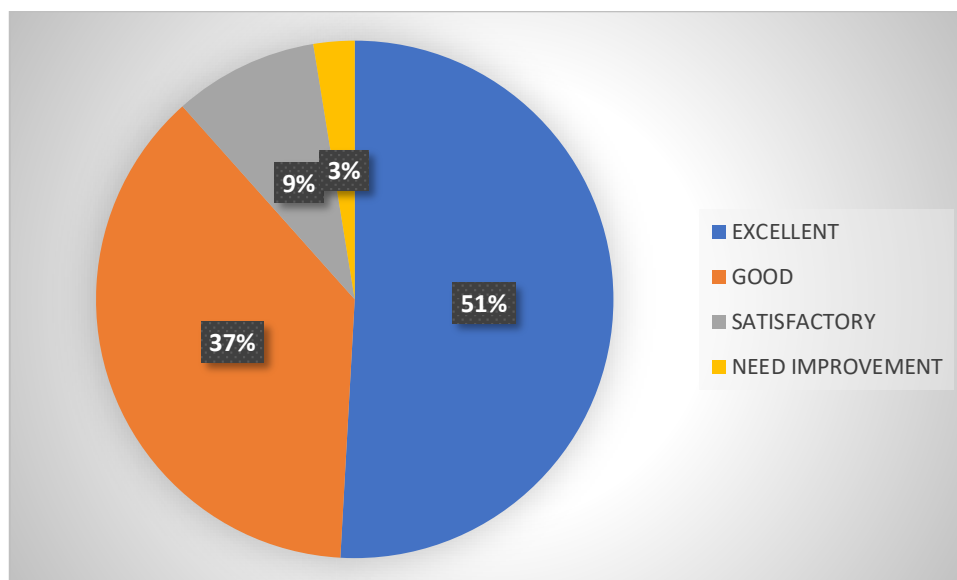


Inference:
