#### **Report**

The department of Social Work, Guru Nanak College, Chennai organized a One Day National workshop titled "Substance Abuse Counselling" on 6<sup>th</sup> September 2018. The workshop had eminent dignitaries in attendance. The Chief Guest for the day was Dr. R. Dhanasekara Pandian, Professor of Psychiatric Social Work, NIMHANS, Bangaluru and Treasurer, Indian Society of Professional Social Work. The Guest of Honor was Dr. E. Sinu, Associate Professor and Consultant at Centre for Addiction Medicine, Department of Psychiatric Social Work, NIMHANS, Bangaluru. Dr. Yamini Kannappan, Consultant Psychiatrist, Kauvery Hospital, Chennai also attended the workshop as a resource person.

The workshop was attended by a wide variety of people interested in substance abuse counselling from both the academic as well as professional perspective. Audience members consisted of under graduate and post graduate students from various colleges across the country, faculty members across different disciplines like Psychology, Sociology, Social Works, Film Making, people actively working in the field of deaddiction and providing consulting services etc. The organizing secretaries of the workshop were Dr. K. Shanthi (HOD), Mr. E. Horst Kharis and Mr. V. Joel Philip Thomas. The committee members of the workshop were Ms. Parneet Kaur Sandhu, Mr. Susai Raj A., Mr. Antony Sagayaraj, Dr. Yesu Suresh Raj. The students of the Department of Social Work participated actively and enthusiastically in the preparation as well as the execution of the workshop.

The activities of the day were started by Dr. M. Selvaraj, Principal, Guru Nanak College. He gave an insight into the effect that substance abuse has on people who engage in this behavior and the effect it has on their loved ones. He also pointed out the need for close knit relationships to combat the ever-present danger of substance abuse in our society. Dr. Gunita Arun Chandok, Director, Guru Nanak College gave felicitation of the workshop. She pointed out the understanding of substance abuse and it's far reaching consequences in terms that served as an excellent beginning for the members of the audience who were not well versed in the medical jargon of the field of addiction medicine.

The workshop consisted of an introductory session, a session that focused on the medical, psychological and physiological aspects of addiction and an interactive workshop session that fully engaged all the audience members. The introductory session was delivered by Dr. Pandian and gave an excellent over view of the problem of substance abuse and its development and

current trends in our society were highlighted with illuminating statistical data. He further talked about the symptomatic behavior a potential substance abuser might depict and what family members, friends, consultants and medical practitioners can do to make the road to recovery easier. Dr. Yamini's session focused on the neurological and neuro-psychological effects of substance abuse. She also talked about the pathology of addictive behavior and how the brain functions under the repetitive distress of substance abuse of various kinds. Her session brought about an objectivity to the often misunderstood topic of substance abuse and the individuals suffering from it. She stressed on the role of medicine in the process of deaddiction and the need for well qualified and well-trained personnel undertaking this endeavor. The workshop ended on a positive note with a feedback session that clearly indicated how helpful and thought provoking the audience found
