
10. SHORT STORY WRITING

Report

The English Association of the Department of English (Shift I), Guru Nanak College (Autonomous), Velachery, Chennai organized a Workshop on Short Story Writing for the II Year Foundation English students on the 21st February at the T5 Smart Classroom from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Ms. Meera Sundararajan, Author of the book "Bridges and Crossings" and avid Blogger was the resource person. The purpose of the Workshop was to encourage and motivate the students to write creatively. The Second Year students have Story Writing as part of their syllabus for Foundation English. In order to guide the students about the creative process, this workshop was conducted. The workshop had 50 participants from all the departments. Ms.P.Anushia, Assistant Professor of English and Vice President of the English Association welcomed the gathering. The Student Secretary of the English Association, S.Pratiksha introduced the resource person Ms. Meera Sundararajan. Mr.B.Kumaran, Associate Professor and Head, Department of English and Dr.L.R.S.Kalanathi, Associate Professor and Vice Principal (Student Affairs), addressed the students emphasizing the importance of the Workshop. Ms. Meera Sundararajan presented a comprehensive PowerPoint Presentation that introduced the term Creative Writing, its types, process and structure of creative writing. The students were taught how to identify the various components in the structure of a story. The second session of the workshop focused on the group activity assigned to the participants. Selected participants were divided into groups of seven and were assigned the task of writing a short story as a group. The groups were given separate visual prompts and were asked to come up with a story. Each group presented their story and the story was analysed and discussed by the rest of the participants. The students identified the elements of the story as discussed in the presentation given in the first session. The resource person shared her valuable inputs about the stories and appreciated the creative efforts of the budding writers. The critical analysis of the stories by the resource person helped the students to gain a better understanding of the process of story writing.
